- 5. Full-time enrollment each term of award
- 6. You have applied to and been accepted by the college you will attend this fall

Below is a brief summary of Charlotte Hackney Sharpe, who she was and what she accomplished after graduation from Haysi High School in Dickenson County in May, 1960. It is to honor her memory, her family, and her accomplishments that the scholarship fund has been created.

Fund description

Charlotte Hackney walked every day 3 miles down the mountain (Rakes Ridge, now known as Hackney Ridge), regardless of the weather, just to catch the school bus to Haysi High. Monday through Friday she faced the same three miles trudging up the mountain at the end of every day. In total, she walked 5,400 miles and did not miss a single day. Having perfect attendance, making Honor Roll every year, and graduating third in a large senior class, Charlotte wanted more than anything to go to college and to graduate. However, her family couldn't possibly afford it on her father's coal miner's pay. Charlotte was one of eleven children of Howard and Lona Hackney of Hackney Ridge, high above the town of Haysi, population 477.

Her teachers and friends, amazed by and in appreciation of her perseverance and integrity, scraped together just enough to obtain a small loan to help her get through the first year of college. After that, she would be on her own to earn it for the other years, and she did. Upon graduation from Haysi High School in 1960, she went directly to summer school to begin her freshman year at Hiwassee College. Charlotte eventually made it to Nashville where she attended and graduated from the prestigious George Peabody College for Teachers with a degree in Biology as well as a teaching degree.

In 1973, she met John Sharpe, the man who would eventually become her husband and who was at her side for 47 years of loving, living and making the most of every day together. At age 79, Charlotte Hackney Sharpe passed peacefully in her sleep of natural causes on December 22, 2020.

John Sharpe created this fund to honor her memory and her determination to overcome all odds and graduate college and go on to a successful and fulfilling life. At the same time, John wished to honor her family and her community in order to create a legacy for her in Dickenson County and at Ridgeview High School.
